

MIDDLETOWN SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Seniors planning to continue their education after graduation are eligible to apply for Middletown Scholarships. There are two types of scholarships: merit based and needs based. Merit based applications are considered on the basis of academic achievement. Needs based applications are considered on the basis of financial disclosure to determine the extent of financial need. Scholastic achievement is also given consideration.

By completing the attached application, seniors are considered for a number of scholarships (see below). Other scholarship committees (i.e. Lion Hall of Fame) will select *their* interview candidates based on the recommendations of the Middletown Scholarship Committee.

In addition to the individual awards listed above, the Howard D. Osborn Memorial Scholarship Program, a perpetual endowment, is available to qualified students who apply. These scholarships may be awarded to Middletown graduates up to and including their third year of college provided they meet expected standards. Valedictorians who apply are eligible for continuous, three-year awards under the Osborn Scholarship Program.

The Scholarship Committee designated by the Board of Education will interview all eligible students submitting applications for scholarships. All information provided on the application is held in strict confidence. Availability of scholarship funds varies from year to year, based on interest earned from perpetual endowments. Scholarship recipients will be announced at the annual Senior Awards Night in May.

MIDDLETOWN HIGH SCHOOL NORTH SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

The *Howard D. Osborn Memorial Scholarship Program* is a perpetual endowment available to qualified students who apply for consideration. The scholarship is available to Middletown graduates up to and including their third year of college providing they meet expected standards.

The Scholarship Committee approved by the Board of Education interviews eligible students who submit this application for scholarship consideration. Information provided on the application is confidential. Availability of scholarship funds varies from year to year based on interest earned from perpetual endowments. Scholarship recipients will be announced at the annual **Senior Awards Night in May.**

There are two types of scholarship applications:

- Merit applications are considered on the basis of academic merit, extra curricular activities, and service.
- Need applications are considered on the basis of financial need and academic merit.
