AES Engineers, a local consulting firm, is committed to continuing its support of higher education by providing scholarships to deserving students. To be eligible the student needs to answer one of the essay questions that they will find on the web site at <http://www.aesengineers.com/scholarships.php>. AES believes that achieving a high grade point average should not be the only criteria for determining who deserves to be helped. For that reason they are offering a scholarship that will be awarded on the basis of character, as determined by evaluating the essays that are submitted. The award is valued at \$500. Deadline for entry is October 8, 2010. Further information, including previous winners, is available on the web site.

The Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity sponsors the Dr. James W. Parker and Henry Robinson Scholarship Awards. To be eligible, candidates must be African-American men or women, seniors enrolled at a high school in Monmouth or Ocean County with a B average or above. Three letters of recommendation are required as is a two-page letter outlining your background, the objectives of your educational program, and career plans. Financial need is considered. Application deadline is March 15, 2010.

Fairleigh Dickinson University offers several scholarship opportunities to entering freshmen. Colonel Fairleigh S. Dickinson Academic Scholarships provide \$16,000 - 22,500 per year to freshmen with 1200 SAT's and 3.5 grade point averages. Deans' Scholarships provide \$10,000 - \$15,750 per year to those with 1050 SAT's and 3.0 grade point averages. Provosts' Scholarships offer \$3,500-\$9,500 per year to entering students with strong academic records and proven leadership or community service. FDU Need Based Grants provide up to \$20,000 to students with financial need. Details are on file in the Guidance Office.

Foster & Adoptive Family Services offers scholarships and grants to foster and adoptive high school seniors who have been under the care of the Division of Youth and Family Services (DYFS). Students attending a New Jersey public college or university may receive up to the full cost of tuition. Applications are available in the Guidance Office. An essay and a letter of recommendation are required. Deadline is March 19, 2010.

The Monmouth County Education Association is again making scholarships available to the children of MCEA members. Emphasis is based on academic achievement and community service. The New Jersey Center for Tourette Syndrome offers the 2010 Children's Scholarship Award to a graduating senior who has been diagnosed with Tourette Syndrome and who will be continuing his/her education at a college or trade school this fall. The recipient will be chosen based on his/her academic record, recommendations, and appropriate talents as demonstrated by means of an audiotape, compact disc, videotape, or digital video disc. The New Jersey State League of Municipalities sponsors the Louis Bay II Future Municipal Leaders Scholarship. The statewide scholarship competition centers on the theme, "What My Mayor and Governing Body Do Best." The competition is open to juniors and seniors who reside in New Jersey.
