With the institution of Block scheduling in the 2012-2013 school year, the number of credits students complete each year were increased from 35 to 40. Beginning with the graduating class of 2016, every student will have the opportunity to earn a total of 160 credits over four years.

**CURRICULUM**

In recognition of the diverse abilities, interests, and demonstrated achievements of students, Middletown High School North offers instruction at various levels of academic rigor to ensure student success. Courses are offered at the Advanced Placement (AP), Honors (H), and College Preparatory (CP) levels. Through Dual Enrollment Programs with Seton Hall University, Rider University and Brookdale Community College, students have the opportunity to earn college credits for Advanced Placement courses taught at Middletown High School North by North faculty. In addition to the traditional curriculum, students are also offered the opportunity to participate in a Vocational Education program which is offered in conjunction with the Monmouth County Vocational School District.

**RANKING SYSTEM**

An unofficial Class Rank, based on weighted GPA, is computed at the end of a student's junior year, as well as after completion of the first three marking periods of the student's senior year. Students will be ranked via their weighted GPA, using the same time frames outlined above. All honors courses are weighted at 1.2. AP courses are weighted at 1.3. All other full year courses will be weighted at 1.0. Semester courses will be weighted at 0.5, Physical Education (3 quarters) will be weighted at 0.75, and Health Education (1 quarter) will be weighted at 0.25. A student who chooses to have his/her class rank released must return the "Rank Release Form" signed by both the student and the parent.
