Income Guidelines as of **October 1, 2018.**

- Demonstrate that gas and/or electric account is currently 45 days or more past due and/or have received a disconnection notice.
- Demonstrate that 2 payments of at least \$25 each have been made within the past 6 months onto the gas and electric account or one payment of \$75 or greater within the past 90 days*. (\$150 if combined account [gas and electric])
- **Must not currently be receiving benefits through the USF program, or have received HEA benefits during the current heating season.**
- **All required documentation must be provided with the completed application. Any applications that are missing any required documentation will NOT be processed.**

*** Eligibility Notice: Households applying for PAGE that have \$15,000 or more in liquid assets (savings, stocks, bonds etc) will be deemed ineligible for benefits ***
